Dear MAMI family,

It is hard to imagine the suffering and need in Haiti after the devastating earthquake on Aug. 14. Death and destruction are now eclipsed by the need for shelter, food and water, the basics of life.

We are reaching out to our MAMI family to be part of a global Oblate effort to assist Haitian families in our

several Oblate parishes in that devastated country.

In addition to claiming more than 2,000 lives and injuring thousands more, the earthquake heavily damaged many Oblate properties and parishes in the hardest-hit area. The destruction is especially widespread over the southern part of the country. Many of the churches and Oblate houses in that region were destroyed. While there were no Oblate deaths, some Oblates were injured and two men who worked for the Oblates were killed. Many parishioners died in their homes when their houses collapsed. Some children were crushed at a baptismal ceremony at one of the parishes. What may have been a distant country has now become very close to home.

Father Ellince Martyr, the Oblate Provincial in Haiti, writes: "We were hit to the bone; knocked down but not destroyed."

Oblate organizations around the world similar to MAMI are responding with funds to buy food, drinking water, medicine and clothing. Poland has committed \$5,000 (USD); Australia committed \$50,000 (AUD); Ireland has committed \$11,450 (USD); OMI Lacombe Canada has committed \$20,000 plus another \$10,000 it hopes to raise with the assistance of MAMI supporters.
